Print and audio-visual materials include bestselling titles and classic older fiction, popular non-fiction, magazines, DVD films, audiobooks on CD, 'Playaway' MP3s, and a CD Music collection.

The Virtual Library is a compilation of electronic resources that can be used from home 24 hours a day, 7 days a week!

Children will enjoy browsing picture books, easy readers, popular series fiction, classic fiction and non-fiction books. In addition, there are audio books, feature and non-fiction DVD films, and music CDs for their entertainment and enjoyment.

Museum Passes are available for borrowing to one of many area museums.

GETTING A LIBRARY CARD

Registration forms are available at the Circulation Desk; bring a driver's license, tax, or utility bill as proof of residence.

PRINT COLLECTION

- Fiction and non-fiction books, including bestsellers and large-print books.
- Young Adult Fiction, series Fiction and graphic novel collection.
- Popular magazines for adults, teens and children; local and national newspapers.
- Ability to place requests on most items and borrow from other libraries using ALISCat online at: www.alisweb.org

AUDIO-VISUAL COLLECTION

- DVDs for children, teens and adults.
- Audiobooks for children and adults, on CDs, and 'Playaway' dedicated MP3 players.

ELECTRONIC COLLECTION

The Virtual Library provides free access to subscription resources for student and job research or recreation. Find down-loadable audiobooks and e-books from the Nassau Digital Doorway. Borrow an MP3 player and FM car adapter for an 'On the Go' experience.

PUBLIC ACCESS COMPUTERS

The library has several personal computers for public use with Internet access, office suite software, and network printing. Or use the wireless network with your laptop.

LOWER LEVEL: Children's collection, Parent Collection, Story-Time Stairs, restrooms, water fountain.

UPPER LEVEL: Adult collection, the Teen Corner, public access computers, copy machine.

GROUND LEVEL: Circulation Desk.

The Library is fully accessible. A lift is available for people who need help with stairs.

PARKING

The parking lot belongs to the Town of Oyster Bay. Be sure to park in the 2-hour spaces located in the center of the lot or in long-term *unrestricted* parking at the south end of the lot. You may park in long-term *restricted* parking on weekends and evenings. However, a TOB sticker is required during weekday business hours.
