Site Preparation for Your New Library Facility Has Begun!

The Board of Trustees is pleased to announce that construction for the New Library Project has commenced! During the months of June and July, site clearing will begin and tree protection will be put in place to protect the trees and shrubs that will remain. The site plan that was approved by the Town of Oyster Bay Department of Environmental Resources was carefully designed to minimize site disturbance. Although certain trees and shrubs will be removed, the site plan proposes to maintain a good portion of the existing mature and higher caliper trees. All overgrowth on the site will be removed to accommodate site improvements and a variety of native plantings. Once the new Library is completed, there will be an overall increase in useable community green space. Watch for progress updates via our website and future newsletters. We look forward to sharing our progress with you!

As residents, the Board members understand the importance of minimizing the impact of construction on the community and thank you for your patience as we move forward. We continue to work with H2M Architects & Engineers, who developed the construction documents, and with Stalco Construction, who will construct the building and complete all of the site improvements. We are extremely confident in the abilities of these two companies to deliver the library facility this community deserves.

GOLD COAST MEMORIES

William Robertson Coe and the Planting Fields Arboretum

Many of the lavish 20th century estates that once dotted Long Island's North Shore - giving it *The Gold Coast* nickname - are gone. Thankfully, others were saved and opened to the public. Planting Fields in Oyster Bay is one - of only a few - that has kept its land and buildings as pristine as they were when privately owned.

A lawyer named James Byrne first built a country retreat on the property in 1908. William Robertson Coe, an English insurance executive and entrepreneur, purchased the property from Byrne in 1913. After the Byrne house was destroyed by fire, Coe had an English Tudor-style mansion built on the site.

Coe's keen interest in horticulture inspired him to have trees and plants imported from around the world. The Olmsted Brothers, sons of the famed landscape architect Frederick Law Olmsted, were hired to reconfigure the property; gardens and structures were added well into the 1930s. The shared vision of Coe and the Olmsteads reinvigorated the 409 acres of rolling lawns, formal gardens, and woodland paths.

Coe deeded his estate to New York State in the early 1950s with the provision that it be maintained for educational purposes. In 1955 it became the State University Center on Long Island at Oyster Bay, the temporary home of SUNY Stony Brook while that campus was being built further east.



Planting Fields Arboretum welcomes 200,000 visitors annually; it is one of the many cultural and educational places that you and your family can visit for FREE if you have a Gold Coast Public Library card. *Go to goldcoastlibrary.org/museum-passes* for further details.


