2024 Gold Coast Public Library Budget Update: A Thank You and Good News!



On September 12th, residents approved the 2024 proposed operating budget of \$2,556,200; incumbent Trustees Valerie Lynn and Julie Rooney, as well as first-time candidate Tom Parnell, were elected to serve 3-year terms beginning in January, 2024. Thank you for your support! Subsequent to the vote, the Library became aware of a Direct Tax Assessment Payment, estimated to be \$496,000, that would be received from LIPA in 2024. While still investigating what this means for future years, the Board of Trustees took immediate action to use these funds to reduce

the 2024 Tax Collection by \$496,000. This will result in a 23% reduction in what residents pay in Library Tax in 2024. Information on the Library's Approved 2024 Budget can be found on the Library website at *goldcoastlibrary.org/budget*.

Unknown Country (2023)



SPECIAL EVENTS AND COLLECTIONS

Shred Your Documents Safely and Securely at the Library! Saturday, November 4th, 9AM to Noon

A Shred Away helps you shred your personal documents safely and securely! So you'll know what to expect, here are the guidelines for the day:

1) The truck is located against the LIRR sidewalk directly across from the Library. Library Staff and *A Shred Away* representatives are there to help you with your items. Service is first come, first-served, and typically takes only a few minutes per person. You don't need to arrive at 9AM; arrive any time within the 3-hour timeframe. *The truck leaves promptly at Noon.*



- 2) When you arrive, drive directly up to the truck or line up behind the cars ahead of you. When it is your turn, Library Staff will take your items up to the truck. We ask that you wait until your items have been shredded so that we can return your bags and boxes to you.
- 3) In order to accommodate everyone, we ask that you bring **no more than 5 boxes or bags at one time.** If you need to bring more than 5, you are welcome to come back multiple times. We may also be able to allow more during lulls in the line. Also, you must take your boxes or bags home.
- 4) All forms of paper are accepted, including manila folders; but **NO HANGING FOLDERS of any kind, particularly if** they contain metal clips.

Gold Coast Memories / New Library Construction Update

Connecting the Past and the Future

On September 6th, the work of constructing a new Gold Coast Public Library building began. Site-clearing, including the demolition of an existing brick house on the property, was the first visible sign that this overgrown, mostly-vacant lot is to become a vibrant new meeting place for everyone in the community.

The bricks used in the construction of that house had been manufactured just a few yards away. The site of the new

library and much of the adjacent property along Glen Head Road was, until the late 1930s, a brick manufacturing business known as the Post Brick Company. The company at its peak employed 55 people. Much of the pre-WWII brick construction not only in this library district but also in the rest of Nassau County used bricks inscribed with the "POST" stamp. The photo above (provided through the courtesy of John Mulder) depicts the factory's kiln.





On September 6th, 2023, the Library's contractor, Stalco Construction, began site clearing for the new Library, including demolition work on the house. Waste materials have been moved off-site for responsible disposal. Two entranceways have been cleared; and a temporary fence has been installed. After demolishing the house and at the request of the Library Board of Trustees, Stalco kept a good number of bricks. These bricks will be displayed on the grounds of the new library, connecting the community's past to

its future. Clearing the remainder of the site and installing adequate drainage is the next step.
